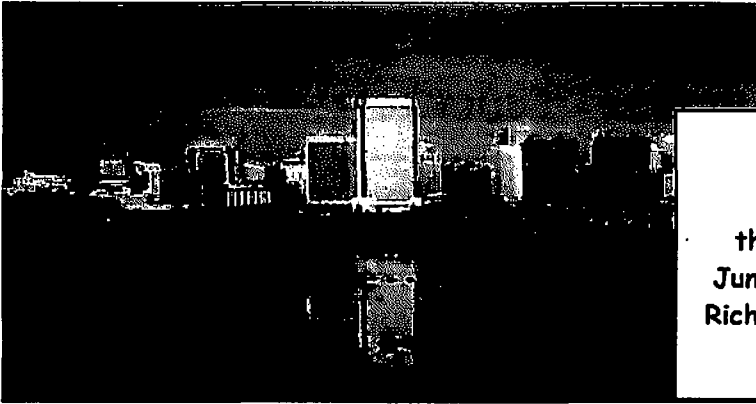

WELCOME BACK TO RICHMOND!

The River City has been selected to host the 32nd National Veterans Wheelchair Games - June 25 - June 30 2012. The Games originated at Richmond's McGuire Veterans Affairs Medical Center 32 years ago!

The town of Richmond, named for Richmond-upon-Thames, England, was founded in 1737 by Colonel William Byrd II and was incorporated as a city in 1742. Patrick Henry's famous "Give me liberty or give me death" speech, given at Richmond's Saint John's Church in 1775, was one of many key events of the American Revolution that took place in the city. During the early 1780s, Richmond became the state capital of Virginia. Today, Richmond is the financial, commercial, and manufacturing center of the state of Virginia. Home to more than 200,000 people, Richmond is Virginia's fourth largest city.

Since 1946, the Richmond Veterans Affairs Medical Center has been improving the health of the men and women who have so proudly served our nation. We consider it our privilege to serve the health care needs of Veterans in any way we can. Services are available to more than 200,000 Veterans coming from 52 cities and counties covering 22,515 miles of central and southern Virginia and parts of northern North Carolina.

The Virginia Mid Atlantic Chapter, Paralyzed Veterans of America and the Richmond VA Medical Center are honored and thrilled to have the Games return to its original site, June 25 - June 30, 2012.
